



•Falls are the second leading cause of unintentional injury deaths.

•37.3 million falls that are severe enough to require medical attention.



•Strategies should emphasize education, prioritizing fall-related research.



Implications for policy or practice: The program offers an innovative approach that can complement and strengthen existing preventive programs, transforming children from passive to active subjects in case of a fall.
