Create a generational shift in how water safety is viewed by children, parents and community leaders

- Advocacy
- Education
- Access
- Community-wide engagement



A, B, C, D's OF WATER SAFETY

A key component of the ZAC Camps is learning the importance of following the A, B, C, & Ds of water safety:



A is for Adult

Children should never have access to any form of water without an adult who has eye-to-eye contact with them.





B is for Barrier

Barriers, like fences and gates, should restrict children's access to all forms of water. Children need to know how important barriers are and their role in keeping children safe.



C is for Classes

At the appropriate age, children need to take swimming lessons. Each family should discuss this with their pediatrician to decide when their child is ready for swimming lessons.



D is for Drains and Device safety

Pool drains are dangerous to all swimmers. Children should never swim near pool or hot tub drains. Children should be taught to tell an adult if they see a broken or loose drain cover and should NOT return to the pool until the drain cover has been replaced.

Additionally, everyone should wear a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket on open water.

ZAC CAMPS

- 20 camps each spring and summer
- In 25 states, 50 cities
- 110-120 campers
- "Super camps" in select markets
 - Provides children access to water (pool) and trained instruction
 - Introduce basics of water safety
 - Bring community together to raise awareness for drowning prevention
 - Elected officials
 - Community partners
 - First responders
 - Parents
 - Catalyze broader conversation





RESULTS

In the locations funded by The ZAC Foundation, through December 2020



20,000 children have participated in ZAC Camps at Boys & Girls Clubs

7,100 sets of swim lessons to children

330 sets of swim lessons to adults

These are families who likely wouldn't otherwise participate in this lifesaving training.

74 new lifeguards,

1 Lifeguarding Instructor

1 Lifeguarding Instructor Trainer

74 new Water Safety Instructors

9 Basic Swim Instructors

QUIPPED

917 parents and caregivers with water safety knowledge and skills. Of those, **90** also received focused pediatric CPR/AED training, many resulting in certification.


future lifeguards developed through Junior Lifeguarding.

In 2018, two Boys & Girls Clubs locations (Greenwich and Greater St. Louis) began participating in the Aquatic Examiner Service. Each organization received their initial Annual Lifeguarding Operations Assessment, and a total of five unannounced visits occurred.

COMMUNITY DROWNING PREVENTION ACTION PLANS: A WHOLE COMMUNITY APPROACH

Addressing the crisis of drowning requires a "whole community" approach informed by and reflecting the realities specific to individual communities.

For each community, the roundtable and ensuing Drowning Prevention Action Plan can help raise awareness, save lives, and inspire action on the national level.



NATIONAL WATER SAFETY ACTION PLAN



- 10-year plan focused on 5 evidence-based strategies and data/surveillance plus necessary infrastructure and capacity to support implementation
 - Data/Public Health Surveillance
 - Rescue/CPR
 - Supervision/Lifeguards
 - Barriers, Entrapment and Electrical Safety
 - Lifejackets/PFD's
 - Water Safety/Water Competence/Swimming Lessons



















CALIFORNIA WATER SAFETY COALITION



- Launched the California Water Safety Coalition
- Focus areas modeled after the National Water Safety Action Plan
- CWSC to serve as umbrella group for drowning prevention and water safety organizations to collaborate
- "Tip of the spear" for applying (and implementing) the National Water Safety Action Plan in California





A DANGER

Stay Alive - Avoid Piers



Danger Zone - No Swimming

- Swim in designated area, away from this structure.
- If trapped, call for help.
- Call for someone to throw life ring or anything that floats.
- Get to ladder, if possible.











While wearing this tag, I agree to supervise the children in the open water or pool. keeping them in sight at all times.

I will not leave the water area without finding an adult to replace me.













Dangerous Currents

Avoid Dangerous Areas:

 Avoid swimming near piers and breakwalls. Many fatalities have occurred.


First station with Van Buren (MI) State Park

 - Opened door for City
 - Currently have 5 Life Jacket Loaner Stations on City beaches; permission to place 13 more
 - Communities to the north on Lake Michigan have asked for assistance in planning stations
 - Northern Lower Peninsula, East MI, and inland communities planning stations

Water Safety Placemats and Community Partners

- Dream of former Fire Chief Ron Wise
- Designer reached out to SKGSH
- SKGSH clarified with the Great Lakes Water Safety Consortium
- Design was approved
- 10,000 placemats printed with funding from SKGSH, Bronson Wellness Center and GLWSC
- Handed out to restaurants needed an additional 1000
- Need to print for current season
- Placed in Emergency Department waiting room
