








What is Rural?

Population thresholds used to differentiate rural and urban communities range from 2,500 up to 50,000, depending on the definition. (USDA)

Collaboration

Is Multi-County right for you? Ask yourself:

- Are there smaller Coalitions struggling nearby?
- Are your on-hand resources limited?
- Do you spend more time looking for money than helping families?
- Do you feel like you are overshadowed by larger/more urban Coalitions?
- Are you fulfilling Coalition requirements?
- Are there multiple agencies willing to work together?

Assessment

Where to start making a difference? Ask yourself:

- Does your region have a Law Enforcement Traffic Team (GHSP in NC)?
- How closely do you work with the Office of the State Fire Marshall?
- Are you connected to the Child Fatality Task Force?
- What are your local first responders talking about?
- What are caregivers saying on Social Media Platforms?
- What is happening in the community? Are there near-misses?





Resources

What do we have? What do we need?

Ask yourself:

- Are there mutual aid agreements?
- Can you leave your jurisdiction?
- Do you have knowledge and time?
- Who has the "the expert"?
- What can we order for free?
- If it's not free, who can "share the wealth"?
- Are there big-ticket display items to share?






Hot Cars Thermometers

- •What agency has the capacity to maintain operations?
- •Capacity = office, phone/computer, vehicle, "the stuff", financial oversight, storage, purchase power
- •Who can be objective and treat all members fairly and equally for efforts contributed by the group?





Information

What is fact? What is fiction? Ask yourself:

- Are we all giving a consistent message?
- What focus area is important this month?
- Who are credible sources for information?
- Who can help us "spread the word"?
- Do our member agencies need our SK support for topics/events important to their service?

Network

Who is missing from this collaborative effort?
Ask yourself:

- •Who isn't participating now? Did they participate in the past?
- •Is there a potential member or partner who is unwilling to commit to regular participation? What are they able/willing to do?
- •Are the rules/bylaws too restrictive for a rural setting?
- •What might be an incentive to join?
